Engage in Working Groups

Communities impacted by climate change are increasingly turning to the courts to seek remedies, and scientific expertise plays a critical role in informing these legal processes. Scientists can help ensure that courts have the evidence necessary to evaluate climate-related claims, assess responsibility, and build resilience against future climate impacts.

The UCS Science Hub for Climate Litigation offers scientists across disciplines the opportunity to contribute their expertise to climate-related legal cases around the world. The Science Hub working groups bring together experts to develop and apply scientific knowledge, guided by the needs of legal professionals and community partners.

Join UCS Science Hub working groups to communicate scientific research in litigation and legal education. You will build the skills needed to engage effectively in climate litigation, ensuring that courts and legal teams have access to accurate, evidence-based information.

Legal education working group

Participants will develop educational materials to improve understanding of relevant scientific issues by legal professionals, including judges and lawyers. This group will also create opportunities for scientists to communicate complex climate science effectively in various settings, such as media and academic forums.

Case review working group

Experts will review case documents to evaluate how scientific evidence has been applied, identify research gaps, and contribute to publications or white papers. Participants will enhance their ability to analyze legal materials and advise on the integration of science in litigation.

Direct case support

UCS staff regularly receive requests for scientific expertise to support legal teams. Through the working groups, scientists will have the opportunity to gain practical experience by informing and providing scientific guidance on climate-related legal cases around the world.
